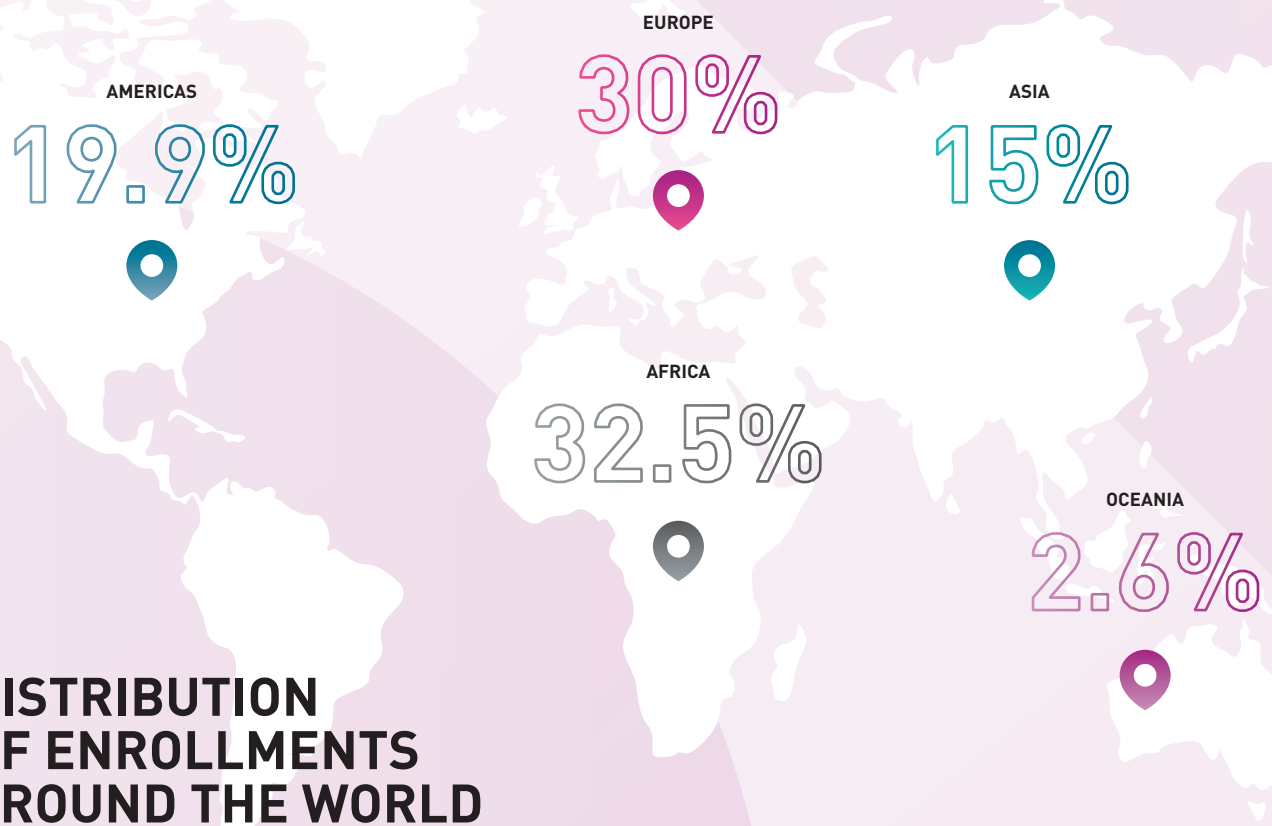


THE CNED AT THE SERVICE OF ALL INTERNATIONAL SUCCESS STORIES

23,000 people enrolled from abroad (including more than 18,000 school-age pupils) benefit each year from teaching and training provided by the CNED.



Education from abroad

The CNED offers solutions that are ever more suitable for expatriation and for education outside French territories thanks to developments made to the services it provides.

Flexible distance-learning options: full or customizable courses on official or free-choice programmes.

Additional international education: for French or French-speaking pupils who wish to prepare for further studies within the French education system or maintain and develop a connection with the French language and French culture (based on the distance e-learning of three fundamental French subjects in addition to local education).

Digital format: middle school and senior high school courses available in digital format for use on mobile devices (tablets, PCs, smartphones, etc.) and for the needs of partner organisations.

Hybridisation: school education through classroom teaching and distance learning within the framework of teaching collaboration agreements, in order to support and develop the network of organisations abroad that follow French teaching programmes.

Partnerships: with the French AEFE organisations (Agency for teaching French abroad – *Agence pour l'enseignement français à l'étranger*) and the MLF (Secular French mission – *Mission laïque française*), with a view to providing continuity of French education services in every context including major crises.

Lifelong education

The CNED contributes to the policy of boosting the attractive image and influence of France abroad by enabling foreigners and expatriates to prepare for French qualifications, to train and to round off their general culture, all through distance learning.

Higher education: a subscribing member of CampusFrance, the CNED contributes to the promotion of French higher education by offering university courses through distance learning.

French as a foreign language (FLE): the CNED supports the influence of the French language by training French teachers (qualification for teaching French as a foreign language – DAEFLE, PROFLE+, FLE course) and students (FLE, preparation for DELF-DALF certifications, etc.).

Continuing education: the CNED supports French expatriates with their career plans and helps them prepare for their return to France (competitive exams, professional training, personal culture, etc.).



Cooperative mission

The CNED actively participates in European and international cooperation promoting the development of distance learning.

Collaborating together to develop distance learning within the framework of bilateral or multilateral relations between countries in partnership with the ministries of Europe and foreign affairs.

Participating in international think tanks monitoring distance learning world-wide: International Council for Open and Distance Education (ICDE), European Distance Learning and E-learning Network (EDEN), Association for teaching French as a foreign language (ASDIFLE), etc.
